Art Department

Elementary Art I

Fine Arts Teacher: Cathy Conroy

Grade Range: K/1st

Tuition: \$136

Materials Free \$25

Students will be encouraged to express their own creativity through a variety of mediums in this early elementary class. We will explore various techniques, study famous artists/art history, and create fun and exciting projects.

Elementary Art II

Fundamentals of Art

Grade: 4th-5th Grade

Tuition: \$136

Materials Free \$25

In this class, your child will be introduced to basic art techniques, which are the building blocks that will provide a solid foundation for future art lovers and artists. Children will explore the great world of art using many different mediums. This unique learning experience places an emphasis on having fun while exploring creativity!

Studio Art: Middle School

Fine Arts Teacher: Jody Warner

Grade Range: 6th-8th Grade

Tuition: \$136

Materials Fee: \$25

This is a class that will help students discern between earlier symbolic drawing to more realistic styles. The class will encourage discussion about differences and help appreciate the two styles. The styles will be allowed for their drawings as well as adjustments and a move forward when each student is ready. Some of the instruction they will learn will be the elements of drawing, use of color, shading and participation in a class pencil and pen and inks Gallery day. They will look at these gifted drafters and learn that a pencil drawing is as valuable as a painting. Students will also have a game show “Pick that Door” to answer questions about the subject of art. To encourage expression and confidence, students will be able to pick a subject of their own to use the skills taught.

Studio Art: High School

Fine Arts Teacher: Jody Warner

Grade Range: 9th-12th Grade

Tuition: \$136

Materials Fee: \$25

This course introduces the student to the value of art in their life. Art is a form of communication that many students have not had the chance or the time to experience. To engage students, they are allowed to draw subjects related to their interests. This increases interest and readiness to move on to new choices and instruction. Gaining confidence moves toward competency. To excite the students to invest in the class, we have a “game show” with teams, and answer questions about the art they have learned. As we near the end of the year, we have a gallery and Café, which opens their eyes to the master’s works. Instruction added to competency and competency in art overflows eventually into competency in other future endeavors.

Sculpture

Fine Arts Teacher: Jody Warner

Grade Range: 6th-8th Grade

Tuition: \$136

Materials Fee: \$25

Through a class in sculpture, students become aware of form, planes, proportion, different angles, measurements up close and distant, foreshortening, light and shadow and finally displaying design by showing their work. Students just can't work on their sculptures without noticing these principles that help them see the subjects they draw as form and not flat representations devoid of shading. Students can't wait to get their hands into the various clays. After work in clays, students finally work on an Armature (the bone of an erect subject). With each project, students draw their subject from different angles. Reports are done on different sculptures worldwide.

Acrylics & Watercolor

Fine Arts Teacher: Jody Warner

Grade Range: 6th-12th Grade / Teacher Rec. Required

Tuition: \$136

Materials Fee: \$25

Acrylics is the most versatile of all mediums making it easy for the beginner and adds challenges enough for the more experienced students. Class will cover materials and techniques well so students can take a few palette colors and learn the importance of value over color. Value helps the student locate what is most important in their work. Opaque watercolors will also be introduced (called Gouache), because it is similar to acrylics and also beginner friendly. Eventually, we move on to watercolor with its wet in wet, washes, wet on dry, and more! Students will do projects in each medium starting them on an exciting journey as painters. Skills in Sumi-e (Japanese brush painting) are revisited and new skills added to strengthen the use of brushes and effects.

Portraiture

Fine Arts Teacher: Jody Warner

Grade Range: 9th-12th Grade / Teacher Rec. Required

Tuition: \$200

Materials Fee: \$25

This course is designed to give the student a simple but thorough procedure for drawing or painting and convincing portrait. There are steps in this experience. Generally, we first evaluate the character of the subject by being accurate and true concerning the subject's appearance. Secondly, we will learn to reproduce the subject's image as simply and faithfully as we possibly can while using an economy of strokes. We paint what we see.

And painting what we say, the student should notice the subject's traits, which, together with what has already been mentioned, takes in the subject's total character.

Even more interesting in portraiture is that you must inject your personality into the effort, so the work becomes a personal statement of appreciation - A pictorial reproduction of the divine creation, a human life.

Animal Art

Students will enjoy honing their skills working in a variety of media to portray animal subjects. Consideration will be given to animal habitat, composition editing and technique.

Graphic Novels & Animation: High School

This class is a step beyond cartoon characters to serve as an introduction to motion design and movie making, through the use of graphic novel illustration and design. The students develop creative images through which they tell stories, which sets the screen for promoting thoughtful concepts and expressing various emotions, situations, and challenges. This class explores the dynamics of creating characters, dialogue, and images, while developing a storyboard.

Lessons are designed for a student to:

1. Develop artistic skills.
2. Study human anatomy - learn to create movement through images.
3. Develop dialogue appropriate to specific characters.
4. Expand communication skills through story telling.
5. Learn to follow instructions and use class time wisely.
6. Experience the stages of character development and ideation to executing the end product.

Ceramics I

Fine Arts Teacher: Evie Venturini

Grade Range: 4th & up

Tuition: \$136

Materials Fee: \$35

This introduction to ceramics is intended for grades 4-6, as well as first and second year pottery students of all grades. They'll learn about pinch, coil, and slab creations, and techniques specific to successfully working with ceramic clay. Students will create functional and beautiful works of art with low-fire clay and glaze.

Ceramics II

Fine Arts Teacher: Evie Venturini

Grade Range: Teacher Recommendation Required

Tuition: \$136

Materials Fee: \$35

Intended for students who have gained a working knowledge of ceramics techniques explored in Ceramics I, this class will continue to create beautiful and functional art using low fire ceramic clay and glaze. Using the same building techniques of pinch, coil, and slab, we will focus more on elements of design, added textures, and pay closer attention to the "finishing details" of working with clay. Each student will also create a bowl to be submitted to the Empty Bowls Project, a fundraiser for Family Promise (an organization that helps homeless families become self-sufficient).

Ceramics III

Fine Arts Teacher: Evie Venturini

Grade Range: Teacher Recommendation Required

Tuition: \$136

Materials Fee: \$35

For students who have successfully learned the techniques used for low fire ceramic clay, we will continue learning ways to add details, improve the structure and function of our artwork, and explore new ways of using glaze. Students will be more involved in the planning process of their projects, being able to design their own projects within given guidelines. We will examine the kiln, and learn about loading and firing. Each student will also create a bowl to be submitted to the Empty Bowls Project, a fundraiser for Family Promise (an organization that helps homeless families become self-sufficient).

Sewing Basics

Fine Arts Teacher: Sarah Scott

Grade Range: 4th Grade & up

Tuition: \$136

Materials Fee: \$50

This class would consist of no fewer than eight completed projects throughout the year. Class will be instructed in the basics of hand and machine sewing, fabric and its substrates, and individual projects that will gradually progress in difficulty, culminating in wearable garments for the students. Students will be expected to complete some hand work and design assignments at home and must have a strong desire to learn new techniques and be challenged! Class will have an additional fee for materials and machines. Class is limited to 8 students.

The Art of Quilting

Fine Arts Teacher: Sarah Scott & Renee Couvrette

Grade Range: 5th Grade & up

Prerequisite: Sewing Basics or Teacher Recommendation

Tuition: \$136

Materials Fee: \$50 (covers machines, maintenance, batting, binding, backing and related tools)

Learn the art of quilting in this hands-on, year long sewing class. Students will learn a full range of quilting techniques, including: applique, hand quilting, embroidery, paper piecing, hand piecing, machine quilting, sewing curves, and more! Each quilter will create a throw size quilt (45" x 60") by the end of the year, with many types of quilt blocks represented. We encourage all students to be motivated, as this class will be an exciting challenge! We will take a class field trip to a local fabric store to purchase their quilt fabrics in late summer. Please note the cost for these fabrics is not included in the class fee. **We anticipate an approximate cost of \$30.**

NEW KFA class! Let's read books and make art together! Class will be styled in a book club format, with books read at home and discussed weekly at KFA. Each month, one book will be assigned, and while we discuss literature, we'll make a monthly art project. **Students are expected to come to class prepared with discussion questions and ready to participate.** Art projects will be based on the month's book, and will include collage, sculpture, printmaking, textiles, and more!

There is no art prerequisite for this class, and is an elective for high school students.

Books will NOT be provided, a list will be emailed early summer for your purchase or library borrow. There will be a total of **eight** books required. Some art materials may need to be sourced by the student (i.e. upcycled household items.)

Handwork Class

Fine Arts Teacher: Renee Couvrette

Grade Range: 4th-12th Grade

Tuition: \$136

Materials fee: \$40 (not including field trips)

Pick up your sticks|grab your hooks! This entry- level handwork/craft course is designed to teach students how to knit, crochet and more. Additional work with yarn dyeing, macrame and student interest projects may be explored, as time allows. Design principles and reading patterns will be covered as they relate to each technique. Students can expect to plan, prepare and complete several projects.

Required supplies: notebook, pencil. Additional materials will be provided to ensure sizing is correct. We will discuss this during our first meeting.

Music Department

Musicianship I

Fine Arts Teacher: Joseph Dorsch

Grade Range: K-1st Grade

Tuition: \$68 (½ hr class)

A solid and essential foundation for musical growth is developed by moving to music, singing, and playing rhythm instruments and musical games in a joyful, creative setting. Steady beat, note reading and performing melody and rhythm, singing on pitch, playing in an ensemble, and analyzing and creating musical forms are some of the skills taught at an age appropriate level and will systematically be built upon year by year.

Musicianship II

Fine Arts Teacher: Joseph Dorsch

Grade: 2nd Grade

Tuition: \$68 (½ hr class)

A solid and essential foundation for musical growth is developed by moving to music, singing, and playing rhythm instruments and musical games in a joyful, creative setting. Steady beat, note reading and performing melody and rhythm, singing on pitch, playing in an ensemble, and analyzing and creating musical forms are some of the skills taught at an age appropriate level and will systematically be built upon year by year.

Musicianship III: Recorder & Music Theory

Fine Arts Teacher: Joseph Dorsch

Grade: 3rd Grade

Tuition: \$136

The 3rd grade Musicianship class is designed to teach students to read music – a skill that can be used throughout their lives! To put what they've learned into practice, the students will also learn to play the recorder, a simple woodwind instrument that prepares them to tackle more challenging instruments in a concert band. Students will learn musicality through playing their instrument, participating in music theory games and more! Students will also learn about all sorts of band and orchestral instruments as they use this academic year to discern what instrument they'd like to choose in their 4th grade year. Students are required to have a recorder for this class. A music stand would also be helpful.

Fundamentals of Guitar Group

Fine Arts Teacher: Gil LeDuc

Grade Range: 4th-6th Grade

Tuition: \$150

In Fundamentals of Guitar, no previous music study is necessary. We will learn basic guitar skills such as tuning, finger placement, basic music theory for reading single notes and chords in the first position. With regular and consistent practice, students will gain confidence as they learn to play guitar in a fun, supportive setting. Students must have a guitar tuner. A sturdy music stand is also recommended for home use.

Fundamentals of Guitar Group

Fine Arts Teacher: Gil LeDuc

Grade Range: 7th-12th Grade

Tuition: \$150

In Fundamentals of Guitar, no previous music study is necessary. We will learn basic guitar skills such as tuning, finger placement, basic music theory for reading single notes and chords in the first position. With regular and consistent practice, students will gain confidence as they learn to play guitar in a fun, supportive setting. Students must have a guitar tuner. A sturdy music stand is also recommended for home use.

Intermediate Guitar Group

Fine Arts Teacher: Gil LeDuc

Grade Range: Teacher Recommendation Required

Tuition: \$150

This guitar course is designed as a continuation to students who have taken Fundamentals of Guitar and focuses on reading melody and rhythm guitar skills. Requirements: a good quality acoustic or acoustic/electric guitar.

Prerequisite: Fundamentals of Guitar

Advanced Guitar Group

Fine Arts Teacher: Gil LeDuc

Grade Range: Teacher Recommendation Required

Tuition: \$150

This guitar course is designed as a continuation to students who have taken Fundamentals of Guitar and focuses on reading melody and rhythm guitar skills. Requirements: a good quality acoustic or acoustic/electric guitar.

Prerequisite: Intermediate Guitar

Ukulele Primer

Fine Arts Teacher: Gil LeDuc

Grade Range: 4th Grade & Up

Tuition: \$150

Ukulele Primer is a great introduction to playing a string instrument, no previous music experience is necessary. The student will learn basic skills such as tuning, finger placement, basic music theory for reading single notes and chords in the first position. With regular and consistent practice, students will gain confidence as they learn to play the Ukulele in a fun, supportive setting. Students must have a good quality instrument, and tuner. A gig bag for transporting the instrument and a music stand is recommended for home use.

Intermediate Ukulele

Fine Arts Teacher: Gil LeDuc

Grade Range: Teacher Recommendation Required

Tuition: \$150

Ukulele (intermediate) is for students who have previously taken Ukulele (1st year) The student will learn in a group setting to be able to read and play melodies and or accompany with chordal understanding of the instrument. Students must have good quality instrument, and tuner. A gig bag for transporting the instrument and a music stand is recommended for home use. **Prerequisite:** Ukulele Primer

Violin I: Suzuki Beginner

Fine Arts Teacher: Alyssa Selvig

Grade Range: K & Up

Tuition: \$150

This class introduces students to the basics of violin. Students will focus on posture, bowing techniques, listening and memorization skills, rhythmic counting, and simple note reading. Beginners will use elements in book 1 of the Suzuki program, a supplemental reading book, “I Can Read Music”, and simple one octave major scales to help develop their skills and classical training. Children enrolled in this class will learn not only through practicing the basics, but also singing rhythms and phrases, playing games, and the occasional dance. This class is a great way to get students interested in and actively involved with their classical training while still having fun!

Violin II: Suzuki

Fine Arts Teacher: Alyssa Selvig

Grade Range: Teacher Recommendation Required

Tuition: \$150

This class is for students who have completed Violin I (Beginner Violin). Here we continue developing classical techniques on the violin, delving further into slightly more complicated pieces, bow exercises and expressions, and fine-tuning the musical ear. Students will be using elements of “Suzuki” book 1, one and two octave (beginner to intermediate) major scales, and continue playing through the “I Can Read Music” book. Students will also learn how to utilize basic two part harmony (duets). Intermediate violinists will be working on sight reading slightly more challenging pieces and further developing their memorization skills. A great class for students who want to become well-rounded violinists with a wide skill set and repertoire!

Violin III-A: Suzuki

Fine Arts Teacher: Alyssa Selvig

Grade Range: *Teacher Recommendation Required

Tuition: \$150

An exciting group lesson with the option of joining the String Ensemble as a companion class! This level is for students who have completed Violin II. This group will continue utilizing two octave major scales, finish up the first book of the Suzuki program, as well as the “I Can Read Music” book, before progressing into more complicated sight reading techniques in the “ABC’s of Violin” book 2. Here we begin focusing on musical expression and interpreting the composer’s intended character and emotions behind their pieces. We also venture into duet and trio style music with easy to moderate harmonic and melodic lines.

Violin III-B: Suzuki

This class is for students who have completed Violin III. Students in this class will also join the String Ensemble (which is a companion class). This class is for fairly advanced students and will focus on elements of “Suzuki” book 2, the “ABC’s of Violin” book 2, and two octave major and minor scales. Students making their way through these books will be challenged to step out of their comfort zone as they are introduced to more complicated techniques, such as shifting and vibrato. String Ensemble

Tuition: \$300

A class required for Violin IV up. We work on a wide-ranging and varied repertoire of popular classical pieces, hymns, arrangements of everything from Broadway musicals to Disney soundtracks, and much more! This class is always a lot of fun, and students are encouraged to express their personal goals and expectations of what they would like to learn during the school year. Students will also help select some of the repertoire and will occasionally be assigned the task of searching for pieces they are interested in exploring. We practice leading a small musical group, learning how to queue in and cut off the ensemble, and following basic conducting patterns as well as orchestral etiquette. This class is a wonderful way to round off your musical training while adding a large variety of fun classical and contemporary pieces to your repertoire.

Piano Ensemble

Grade Range: 4th & Up

Tuition: \$300

Students will continue to develop their piano playing skills in a group setting. They will focus on the art of cooperative listening and maintaining a steady rhythm to facilitate playing as a cohesive ensemble. Music and movement is a class that involves fundamentals in music theory, an introduction to instruments, and an introduction to movement and how to use one's body, all while having fun and enjoying the creativity of the classroom! Music and movement teaches students musicality as well as movement awareness and body positions to help the body and mind work together. This course begins with speech, movement, and song. Learners are actively engaged in activities that represent a wide range of musical processes such as developing a sense of the

steady beat and matching pitch and tempo. Musical concepts and vocabulary are also explicitly presented to students in fun, engaging thematic topics. In this course, students will learn about beat, downbeat, tempo, rhythm, and acapella all while learning to dance and move the body in new ways! Students will develop coordination and learn to self express imaginative ideas through oppositional, parallel, and cross-lateral movement to musical rhythm and melody. Lastly, this course will help strengthen motor & memory skills, creativity, and imaginations.

Basic Ballet

Tuition: \$160

Costume: Parent is responsible to buy costume

Basic ballet fundamentals will be introduced and mastered by the end of the year. Basic ballet positions of the arms and feet will be taught, along with basic ballet movements. The children will do a series of exercises at the barre to introduce different steps and basic ballet technique. After barre we will do a series of stretching on the floor then across the floor movement. Creative movement will be woven into the class where the children can experience their own movement and explore how different music makes them feel/move etc. If there is time at the end of class, we may read a ballet story, introduce very basic dance history or watch 5 minutes of a ballet and learn about that particular performance. The purpose of the course would be to teach life skills that the kids can use in and around their own homes and communities. The goal would be to give them a small sampling from each technical trade with some classroom and hands on work. We would spend some time learning the how it works in a typical classroom setting, and then progress to some hands-on practical application. Most of the material that we will use will be provided from left over material from my business, but we may bless the church by fixing anything that can be fixed and used as a lesson. This could look like changing out the components of a non-function toilet, rewiring a light switch, fixing a hole in the drywall, and jobs of this nature. This will help the kids to develop skills that they can use throughout their life no matter what career they end up in but may direct them to a technical trade they find interesting.

Some sample lesson ideas:

Electrical: Simple Electrical Circuit, Difference between AC and DC currents, How a switch works, How to properly size conductor line and devices, Safety around live electrical wires and how to safely test them.

Plumbing: Toilet / Faucet, How it works, How to diagnose the problem, Replacement of the proper parts, Overall look at the plumbing system of a home
